Helen is an experienced historian with over twenty years' experience in heritage and conservation.

Helen has expertise in preparing heritage assessments and conservation management plans of places and precincts, as well as larger areas and complexes. This includes a wide range of urban and rural places, including parks, gardens and cemeteries; industrial sites; and Aboriginal places.

Helen is experienced in developing thematic frameworks and writing thematic histories from single sites to large complex places, groups of like places, and municipalities. She also has experience in Aboriginal cultural heritage and in the preparation of Aboriginal cultural values assessments. She has also prepared significance assessments for local history collections, and text panels for museum and other exhibitions.

Prior to joining GML, she worked as a project historian for multiple heritage firms in a freelance capacity. She is also an award-winning writer and experienced editor, and has written several commissioned histories. She has worked at D.W. Thorpe (Reed Books), where she co-wrote the *Monash Biographical Dictionary of 20th Century Australia* (1994). She was an assistant editor for the major reference work in Australian history: *The Oxford Companion to Australian History*, edited by Graeme Davison, Stuart Macintyre and John Hirst (Oxford University Press, 1998).
